(115)—WARWICK AND BIRMINGHAM CANAL.

(a) Short Description.

The canal commences in Birmingham by a junction with the Digbeth Branch Canal of the Birmingham Canal Navigations near Bordesley Wharf, Lower Fazeley Street, and proceeds by Bordesley and Sparkbrook, in the county of Warwickshire; Hay Mills and Acock's Green, in the county of Worcestershire; Solihull, Knowle, Kingswood, Rowington, Hatton, and Budbrooke, to its termination at Warwick, in the county of Warwickshire.

The length of the canal from Birmingham to Budbrooke is principally used as portion of the through route between London and Birmingham; the short piece of the canal between Budbrooke and Warwick has very little trade on it.
