Several light engineering firms seem to have been resident in the inter-war period before the premises occume the wartime home of Supercars, a firm specialising in the production of small cars for the fairground. The Supercars firm vacated their premises in coventry because of the threats of air-raids, and after the war moved again from Gunnery Terrace to Lock Lane in Warwick. The premises were then used by different firms over time, with a removals business utilising the space for thorage as the last occupant before conversiuon in 1985.
